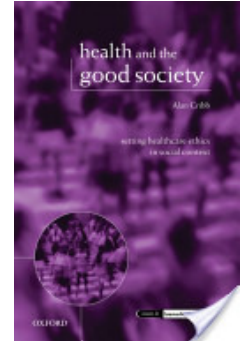

Social Dimensions of Health Institute

Alan Cribb is Professor of Bioethics and Education at Kings College London. Alan's work often brings together applied philosophy and health policy analysis, and Alan was for several years Editor of Health Care Analysis. Alan has written several books as well as numerous journal articles. 'Health and the Good Society' in particular covers many issues of interest to SDHI and CME.



In this seminar I will be sharing preliminary ideas from a new project that is examining the nature and value of health care professionalism and asking in what senses professionalism is still possible and desirable. I will begin to approach some key questions by comparing and contrasting the idea of 'the normative' in philosophy and sociology, by drawing upon some currents of work from both disciplinary traditions and by reflecting upon accounts of professionalism and examples from practice. This line of thought raises issues for professional educators and others interested in analysing, developing and supporting health care professionalism. It should also be of relevance to those interested in discussing the challenges of interdisciplinary inquiry.
